Mayor Bickers called the meeting to order at 6:28 PM after the Public Hearing concluded.

Mayor Bickers led the invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

MOTION by Gormley to approve the minutes of the September 10, 2019 meeting of the BMA. Second by Holley. VOTE: UNANIMOUS. **MOTION PASSES.**

Mayor's Report and Approval of Monthly Financial Report:

Financial report for month ending September 30 was reviewed.

MOTION by Holley to accept the September monthly financial report. Second by Gormley. VOTE: UNANIMOUS. **MOTION PASSES.**

Mayor Bickers reminded everyone about the upcoming Octoberfest on Saturday, October 18. Music by the Chillbillies is lined up also for the pre-October festivities on Friday night. The Mayor reviewed all the featured events and activities for the Saturday event.

Mayor Bickers reviewed the status of the Music Festival to be held at Town Hall on May 29 & 30 in 2020. The Mayor provided some details about the entertainment line-up and plans are for about 4-5 hours of entertainment each night. Formal announcement and final details are expected in early December 2019.

Mayor Bickers communicated that the new guardrail installation is complete on a dangerous curve on Mentor Road.

Citizens Comments: Charles Perry inquired about the status of a property at 2120 Mentor Road where a house had previously burned down. Mr. Perry noted that he has observed multiple vehicles parking on this property. Also, Mr. Perry communicated that construction activities at a new home construction on Mentor Road is breaking down the edge of the pavement. Frank Reed noted that the conditions on Bill Mattison's property has improved some with the moving of some boats. Mr. Reed also inquired about code issues relative to dilapidated mobile homes and the definitions of adequately screened and fencing.

Resolutions and Ordinances:
