1. **Recommendations for paving projects in 2021-22 budget year beginning July 1, 2021:**




2. **Thurston Appeal:** Attorney Gary Prince, representing Mark Thurston, presented an appeal for the Town of Louisville to dismiss the fines imposed on Mr. Thurston for illegal dumping on his property at 3708 Louisville Road. Mayor Bickers employed a court recorder to document all statements and conversation regarding this appeal and the response by the BMA. Mr. Prince presented evidence and documentation pertaining to Mr. Thurston's appeal. Mr. Thurston was not present at the BMA meeting and therefore offered no personal defense of his actions.
