Mayor Bickers called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM.

Mayor Bickers led the invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

MOTION by Kelley to approve the minutes of the September 14, 2021, meeting of the BMA. Second by Gormley. VOTE: UNANIMOUS. **MOTION PASSES.**

Mayor's Report and Approval of Monthly Financial Report:

Financial report for month ending September 30 was reviewed.

MOTION by Gormley to accept the September monthly financial report. Second by Kelley. VOTE: UNANIMOUS. **MOTION PASSES.**

Mayor Bickers discussed the postponed Octoberfest in light of the current improving COVID numbers. The Mayor still feels the best decision was to not have the Octoberfest on October 23. Possible planning to hold a postponed or similar event in April 2022.

Mayor Bickers announced the Christmas Parade will be held this year on December 05. Starting time will probably be 1:00 PM. Details will be forthcoming.

Mayor Bickers reviewed the status of the Smith & Wesson facility to be located in Partnership Park North on Proffitt Springs Road. Part of this industrial park was originally part of the Town of Louisville but was de-annexed to the City of Alcoa in the early 2000's. The new plans call for annexation by the City of Maryville as part of a county-wide commission to review and modify urban growth boundaries in Blount County.

Mayor Bickers communicated ongoing discussions with TVA concerning the pond weed explosion in Lackey Creek embayment. Discussions are underway on how to attack the expansion before this lake area becomes un-navigable.

Citizens Comments: Wes Peters and Nathan Thomas requested assistance from the TOL to address storm water flow from the adjacent property owned by Franklin & Sons. The grading and subsequent storm water runoff is having a negative impact on the Thomas property. Pauline Holtkamp asked how a citizen can have an impact on the Smith & Wesson project as well as the aquatic plant growth in Lackey Creek embayment.


